

June 2, 2020 Novel Coronavirus Case in Tochigi Prefecture (Case No. 66)
Active Epidemiological Investigation (Report No. 1)

June 3, 2020

The confirmed results of the active epidemiological investigation of the case of novel coronavirus (Case 43) declared on June 2 in Tochigi Prefecture are as follows. The information announced today is underlined.

【Patient Summary (Case 66)】

1. Age: 20s
2. Sex: Male
3. Area: Saitama Prefecture
4. Symptoms and progression:

May 25	Fever (38°C range), headache, joint pain
May 26	Consulted with the outpatient clinic for those who have returned from overseas or been in close contact with coronavirus patients, examined at Medical Institute A in Tochigi City. No irregularities in the patient's CT scan. Fever broke at night. Loss of taste and smell late that night to the following morning. No respiratory symptoms.
May 28	Joint pain lessened.
June 1	Examined again at Medical Institute A. Medical Institute A contacted the Prefectural South Health and Welfare Center and samples were collected.
June 2	Tested via PCR and confirmed positive. Hospitalized at a medical facility in Tochigi Prefecture. Current symptoms are loss of taste and smell only.
5. Patient Behavior History
 - Worked from home beginning on April 14 and remained at home in Tochigi City. Wore a mask.
 - Went on a business trip alone to Saitama Prefecture on May 20. Was there for about 20 minutes. Both the patient and the person he met with wore masks. Traveled by public transportation and wore a mask the entire time.
 - Remained at home beginning on May 23 other than medical examinations and shopping trips. Traveled on foot or via mother's car. Wore a mask.
6. People in Close Contact with the Patient
 - Only the patient's mother (no symptoms) was in close contact with the patient. She was

tested via PCR on June 3 and confirmed negative.

- None in the medical facilities due to appropriate infection prevention measures.

7. Protocol from now on

- Any new people who are identified as having been in close contact with the patient will be tested via PCR and placed on health observation or asked to refrain from going out.
