Introduction

Role of the Plan

The *New Tochigi Mirai Souzou Plan* presents the future vision of the prefecture that we aim to achieve together with residents from a medium- to long-term perspective, clarifies the basic directions of policy development toward its realization, and serves as the basic guideline for prefectural administration by setting goals for the next five years as well as priority and strategic initiatives to be undertaken.

It also serves as a common goal for all members of the regional community - including residents, government, NPOs, companies, and organizations - to share awareness of issues and values, and to move forward together toward the realization of the future vision.

In addition, this Plan is positioned as the Prefectural Comprehensive Strategy for Regional Revitalization under Article 9, Paragraph 1 of the Act on Overcoming Population Decline and Vitalizing Local Economy in Japan (Act No. 136 of 2014).

Plan Period

This Plan covers a five-year planning period from fiscal year 2026 (Reiwa 8) as the first fiscal year through fiscal year 2030 (Reiwa 12).

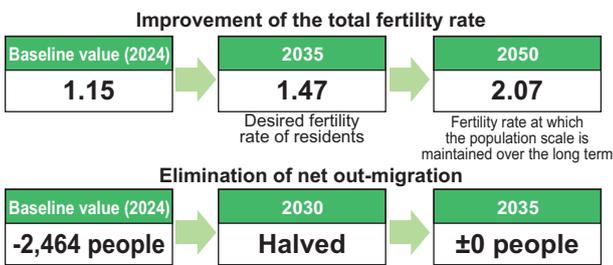
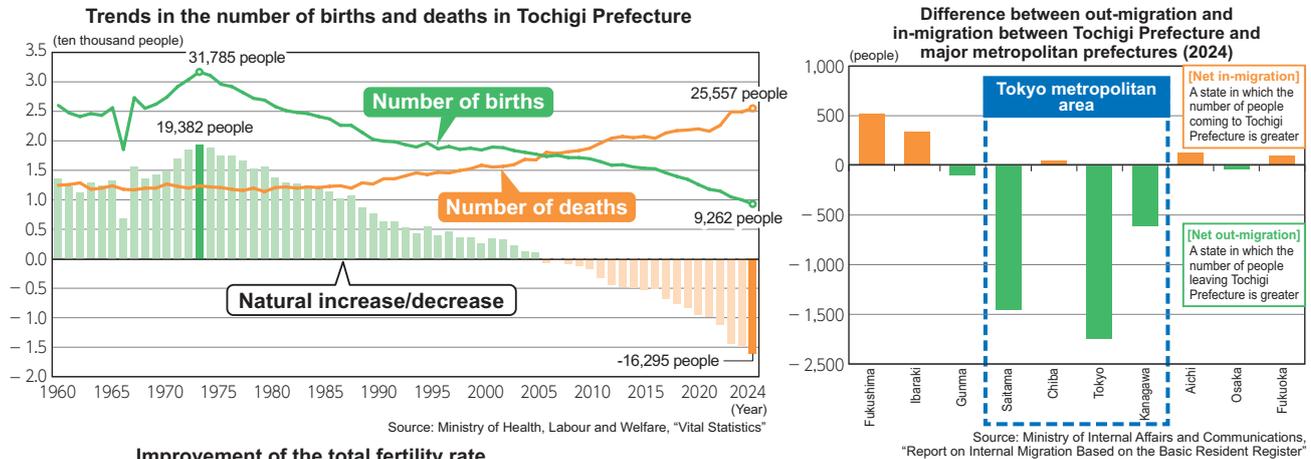

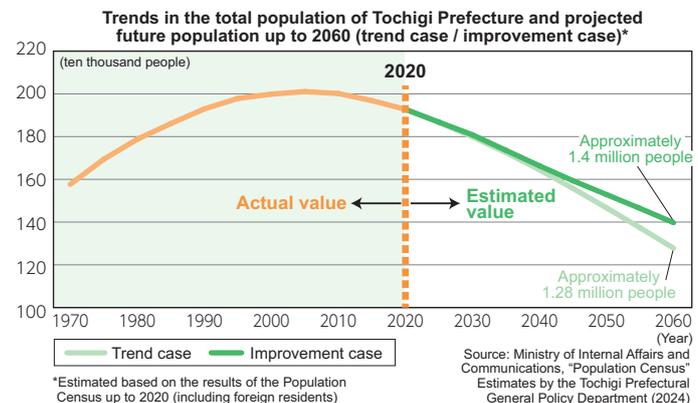

III Future Population Outlook

The total population of Tochigi Prefecture reached a record high of 2,016,631 in Heisei 17 (2005), but thereafter turned to a decline, with the scale of decrease tending to expand. If the trends of declining birthrate and net out-migration to areas outside the prefecture continue, population decline will accelerate, and the population of the prefecture is projected to decrease to approximately 1.28 million by Reiwa 42 (2060).



By gradually improving the total fertility rate and eliminating net out-migration, particularly among young people, the goal is to secure a population of 1.4 million or more by Reiwa 42 (2060).



IV Characteristics of Each Region

In order to revitalize regions and sustain administrative services amid progressing population decline, it is necessary to grasp issues from a wide-area perspective beyond municipal boundaries and to strengthen inter-municipal cooperation as well as prefectural support and coordination. In this Plan, the prefecture is divided into five regions, and wide-area priority issues are described based on the characteristics of each region, the awareness of municipalities, and the topics raised at the Reiwa 7 (2025) block-based meetings of mayors and town/village heads.

V The Future Vision of Tochigi We Aim For

To create a safe, prosperous, and happy Tochigi for people living today and to pass it on securely to the next generations, it is essential to accurately grasp the trends of the times, make use of the prefecture's strengths, and depict a solid future vision in which each resident can hold hope for the future and take pride in their hometown, Tochigi.

In this Plan, the future vision of Tochigi we aim for is set forth as

**Creating Together:
 A Vibrant Tochigi Where People and Communities Both Shine**

And together with the residents of the prefecture, we will devote our full efforts toward its realization.

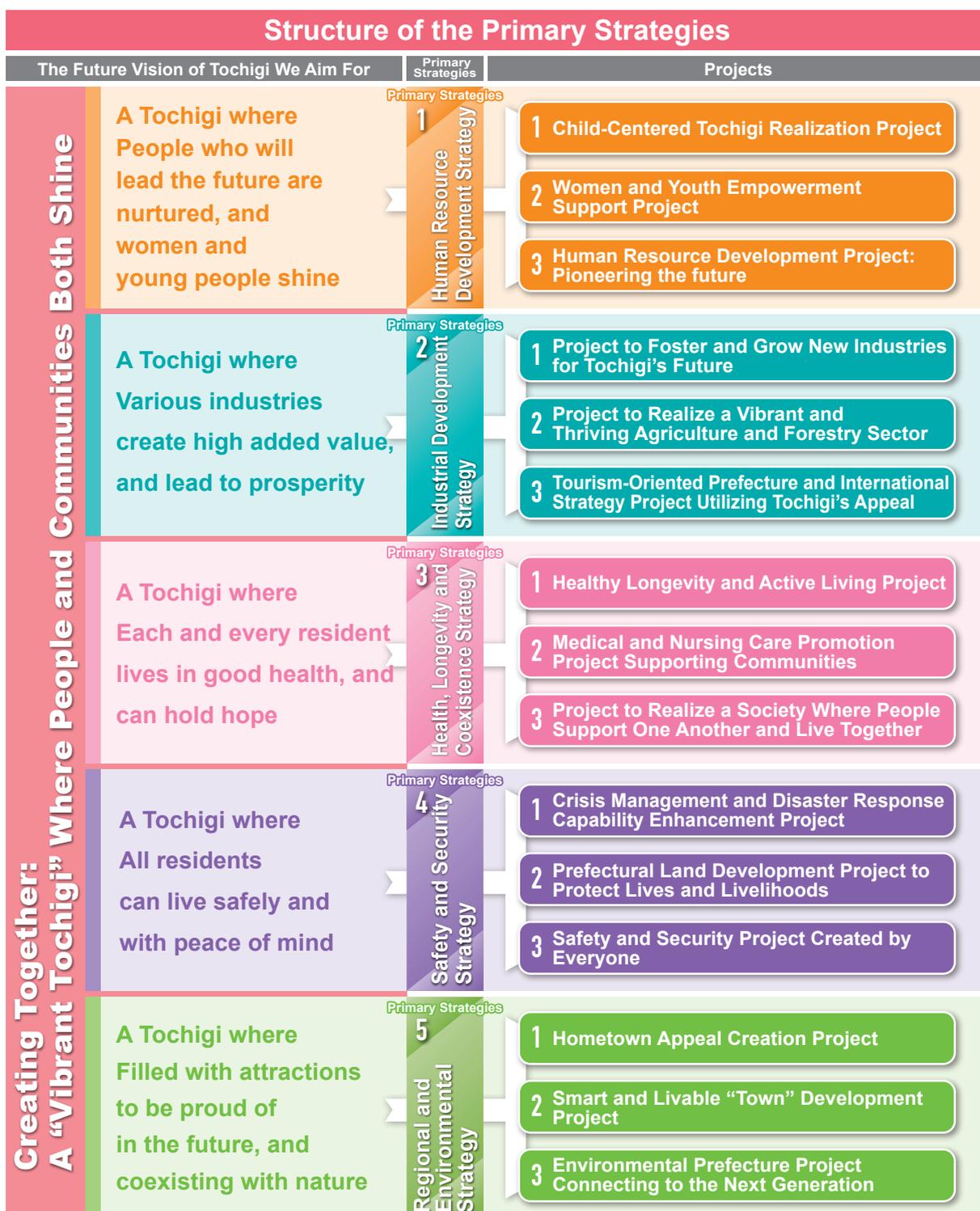
VI Primary Strategies

In order to overcome the various challenges facing Tochigi Prefecture, such as the progression of population decline and the declining birthrate with aging population, and to realize the Future Vision of Tochigi We Aim For while making the fullest use of Tochigi's strengths, these are set as strategies to be addressed with priority over the next five years.

They are composed of five strategies corresponding to the Future Vision of Tochigi We Aim For, and will be promoted while linking them with one another. In addition, each of the five strategies positions three projects that compile priority initiatives, and a total of 15 projects (the Tochigi 15 (Ichigo) Projects) will be promoted.

As people are the driving force behind all activities, including the economy, daily life, and community development, the Human Resource Development Strategy is positioned as the first pillar. Through cooperation, collaboration, and co-creation with residents, municipalities, and others, and under an All-Tochigi framework, we will steadily promote the projects positioned within the five priority strategies while flexibly responding to changes in socioeconomic conditions.

Human Resource Development Strategy

Toward the realization of a Tochigi where future leaders are nurtured and where women and young people can shine, the following three projects will be promoted.



1-1 Child-Centered Tochigi Realization Project

Objectives

We will promote the creation of an environment in which the wishes for marriage, pregnancy, and childbirth are fulfilled, joyful child-rearing is supported, and children are raised by society as a whole, in addition to families, childcare facilities, and schools.

Priority Initiatives

3-1 Healthy Longevity and Active Living Project

Objectives

By implementing, in an integrated manner, initiatives and supportive environments that enable all residents to practice healthy lifestyles suited to each individual - such as routinely incorporating good dietary habits and exercise from a young age - and by promoting disease prevention and early detection, we aim to extend healthy life expectancy.

Priority Initiatives

- (1) Promotion of physical and mental health that enables people to live energetically
- (2) Improvement of the quality of social environments that support individual health promotion
- (3) Promotion of disease prevention, early detection, and early treatment

4-1 Crisis Management and Disaster Response Capability Enhancement Project

Objectives

In order to prepare for large-scale natural disasters anticipated in recent years, we will enhance and strengthen soft measures through collaboration among “self-help, mutual help, and public help,” raise disaster prevention awareness among each and every resident, and build local communities and disaster response systems that are resilient to disasters and other crisis events.

Priority Initiatives

- (1) Enhancement of disaster prevention awareness and promotion of self-help
- (2) Enhancement and strengthening of community disaster prevention capabilities
- (3) Enhancement and strengthening systems to protect residents and communities from disasters and other crisis events

4-2 Prefectural Land Development Project to Protect Lives and Livelihoods

Objectives

In order to protect not only the lives and property of residents but also their daily living and livelihoods from increasingly frequent and severe natural disasters, we will systematically promote hard measures such as the development and maintenance of social infrastructure, as well as soft measures, while taking into account preventive maintenance perspectives and the use of green infrastructure, aiming to build the safest and most secure prefecture in Japan.

Priority Initiatives

- (1) Promotion of social infrastructure development that is resilient to disasters and protects residents' lives and livelihoods
- (2) Promotion of measures to address the aging of social infrastructure
- (3) Securing and development of human resources in the construction industry

Objectives

Priority Initiatives

- (1) Creation of safe communities through crime prevention and detection
- (2) Enhancement of traffic safety awareness and strengthening of measures to prevent traffic accidents

5-1 Hometown Appeal Creation Project

Objectives

By utilizing regional resources such as culture and sports, attracting large-scale events and international conferences, and other efforts, we will create related populations and promote regional revitalization. At the same time, by enhancing regional appeal and fostering affection for and pride in Tochigi Prefecture, we will widely disseminate its appeal both domestically and internationally, aiming to make Tochigi a place that people want to visit, want to live in, and want to continue living in.

Priority Initiatives

- (1) Creation of related populations (promotion of relocation and permanent settlement)
- (2) Community development utilizing regional resources such as culture and sports
- (3) Fostering affection for and pride in Tochigi, and strengthening and expanding “Tochigi fans”

- (2) Promotion of interregional collaboration
- (3) Promotion of DX

5-3 Environmental Prefecture Project Connecting to the Next Generation

Objectives

By encouraging each resident to engage in efforts such as promoting carbon neutrality through the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions, forming a recycling-oriented society through the suppression of waste generation, and conserving and utilizing rich natural environments, we aim to make Tochigi an environmental prefecture that opens the way to the next generation.

Priority Initiatives

- (1) Promotion of carbon neutrality*1 (decarbonization) and adaptation to climate change
- (2) Promotion of transition to a circular economy*2
- (3) Promotion of nature-positive*3 initiatives

VII Toward the Promotion of the Primary Strategies

In order to realize the desired future vision, We will advance the projects within the priority strategies promptly and effectively. To this end, we will actively work on creating environments for cooperation, collaboration, and co-creation with diverse stakeholders, establishing solid administrative and financial foundations, and developing policies based on the national *Comprehensive Strategy for Regional Revitalization*, among others.

1 Promotion of Prefectural Administration through Cooperation, Collaboration, and Co-creation

Based on the concept of supporting communities together and creating the next generation, we will promote prefectural administration open to residents and advance cooperation, collaboration, and co-creation within local communities so that diverse stakeholders can actively participate in building Tochigi and create a vibrant society.

2 Promotion of Tochigi's Local Autonomy through Cooperation and Collaboration with Municipalities

In order for the prefecture to achieve further development toward the future, municipalities must play a central role in their communities and proactively develop policies by accurately grasping residents' needs. With a basic principle of placing importance on municipalities, we will further strengthen cooperation and collaboration under an appropriate division of roles between the prefecture and municipalities, while promoting decentralization reforms.

3 Establishment of an Administrative and Financial Foundation

Based on the *Tochigi Prefecture Administrative and Financial Reform Outline 2026–2030*, and with a view toward the middle of the 21st century, we will effectively utilize limited administrative and financial resources to provide administrative services with a high level of resident satisfaction. Starting with reforms in staff awareness and workplace environments, we will challenge ourselves to establish a sustainable administrative and financial foundation capable of flexibly responding to unforeseen circumstances, through effective and efficient prefectural administration utilizing digital technologies.

4 Coordination with the National Comprehensive Strategy for Regional Revitalization

Toward the realization of the desired future vision of Tochigi, *Creating Together: A Vibrant Tochigi Where People and Communities Both Shine*, the issue of population decline, in particular, has become increasingly serious and is an urgent challenge that requires the entire prefecture to work together, making use of the outcomes of the Tochigi Prefecture Population Future Council.

Under these circumstances, the national government, based on the achievements and reflections of the past ten years of regional revitalization, is working to reassemble regional strengths and realize regions that are strong, prosperous, and new and enjoyable.

As a prefecture, we will incorporate into each project of this Plan various measures that reflect the basic stances, perspectives, and policies presented in the national *Regional Revitalization 2.0 Basic Concept* and the *Comprehensive Strategy for Regional Revitalization*, such as “facing the continued population decline head-on and implementing adaptive measures that enable society and the economy to function,” “creating regions chosen by young people and women,” and “realizing a ‘profitable’ local economy even amid progressing population decline,” and steadily promote them.

In addition, while keeping in view the Regional Future Strategy, which the national government is promoting toward the realization of a “strong economy,” one of the pillars of the *Comprehensive Strategy for Regional Revitalization*, we will also advance initiatives aimed at the growth and development of the prefecture's local industries.
