What Is a Night Junior High School?



Overview of a Night Junior High School

A night junior high school is equivalent to a daytime junior high school.

It is officially recognized as a "junior high school" under Article I of the School Education Act.

- Classes are held five days a week.
- Licensed teachers provide instruction.
- Public schools offer free tuition.
- Students graduate after completing all required studies.

Learners at Night Junior High Schools

For various reasons, people may:



- Have missed the chance to complete elementary or junior high
- Have graduated without sufficient academic learning
- Be foreign nationals without compulsory education

In Japan, compulsory education includes elementary and junior high school.

Number of Students by Grade

We enroll up to 35 students in each grade level.

- Grade placement will be based on an interview.
- You can also enroll starting with the 2nd or 3rd grade.

Who Is Eligible to Enroll?

People aged 15 or older who wish to pursue studies in compulsory education.

- > Requirements
- Applicants should reside in Tochigi Prefecture
- Applicants should be able to attend school daily

If you have concerns about enrollment, feel free to contact us.



We have four classes per day.

- Each class period lasts 40 minutes
- Classes are held Monday through Friday



- W No school on Saturdays, Sundays, and public holidays
- No classes during long vacations(e.g. summer break)

There are two types of learning in the Nihongo Course.

Option I

Standard Nihongo

Standard *Nihongo*

- Basic Japanese
 - + Core Subject Learning

Japanese Language Course (Nihongo)

Hajimete-no-Nihongo

- For 6 to 8 weeks, you will focus primarily on Japanese language study.
- This includes daily-life expressions, hiragana,
 katakana, and basic kanji.



Once you finish "Hajimete-no-Nihongo," you'll move on to the "Standard Nihongo."

Japanese Language Course (Nihongo)

Standard *Nihongo*

- You will take 8 Japanese classes per week..
- You will also study essential academic subjects.



The way you learn differs depending on your Japanese ability.

Enrollment

The entrance ceremony is held in April.

- Enrollment is possible even after April.
- Grade level is determined by interview.
- Grade 3 enrollment is possible until September.



Advancement and Graduation

Grade advancement and graduation take place in March.

- Once you've learned enough, you can advance to the next grade.
- Students in the third grade are eligible for graduation.
- Alternatively, students may continue in the same grade if needed.





Computers for Learning

Each student will be loaned their own computer to support their learning.

- Students will use individual computers in class.
- They are allowed to take the devices home for study.

You can use it at school and at home for review.



Example: Using Computers for Learning

How computers support learning in class.

① You can research things you did not understand.

2 You can translate text, such as words and sentences.

3 You can record photos and videos of your work. 4 You can read what the teacher says as text.

Example: Using Computers for Learning

How computers support learning at home.

- You can review the teacher's lesson later by watching a video.
- 2 You can access the worksheets used in class.

You can catch up on missed classes on your computer.




The school collects about 12,000 yen per year.

You will need indoor sports shoes for gym activities.




Enrollment Steps



Enrollment Steps

Enrollment consists of the following four steps.



Step I: Attend Orientation

 Attend the info session to learn about Tochigi-Manabi-no-Yume-Gakuen.



If you couldn't attend the orientation,
 please contact the Compulsory Education Division.

Step 2: Interview

- All applicants will be interviewed.
- ① Interview Schedule
 - · Weekdays, 9:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m.



Each interview takes 30 - 60 minutes

Step 2: Interview

- ② Interview Location
 - Tochigi-Manabi-no-Yume-Gakuen
 (Tochigi Prefectural Gakuyukan High School)

- ③ What to Bring
 - · Photo ID



- (e.g. My Number Card, Driver's License, Residence Card)
- * We will confirm your eligibility for admission.

Step 2: Interview

4 Interview Topics

- Reason for applying
- Learning background
- · School commute plan
- · Health conditions, etc.





Step 3: Submit Documents

- Submit the documents received during the interview
 - · Send by mail or bring directly to the school
 - Submit within one month of your interview
 - Required Documents
 - (I) Application for Admission
 - (2) Copy of Certificate of Residence
 - (3) Reply envelope with ¥460 in stamps



Documents (I) and (3) will be provided at the interview

Step 4: Receive Notice

- An envelope will be sent to your home.
 - You will receive a notice from
 Tochigi Prefectural Board of Education
 about your admission result.
